Matthew John 21:1-13 New International Version (NIV)

21 ¹Afterward Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Galilee. It happened this way: ²Simon Peter, Thomas (also known as Didymus), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. ³“I’m going out to fish,” Simon Peter told them, and they said, “We’ll go with you.” So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. ⁴Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. ⁵He called out to them, “Friends, haven’t you any fish?” “No,” they answered. ⁶He said, “Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some.” When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish. ⁷Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, “It is the Lord!” As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, “It is the Lord,” he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. ⁸The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for

they were not far from shore, about a hundred yards. ⁹ When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread. ¹⁰ Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." ¹¹ So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, but even with so many the net was not torn. ¹² Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³ Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish.

Dear members & constituents of Cheatham Memorial United Methodist Church,

In 2008, the trustees spent \$14,400 to try and shore up the foundation of the church parsonage. The land that house is located on is black clay and it has been shifting towards the pond north of the church's property. According to Rev. Alan Van Hooser, he and Theresa started to experience foundation issues again several years ago. Since Rev. David McGlocklin and Paula have moved in, they have experienced some major shifts in the foundation.

Problems due to the foundation include:

- The crown molding in rooms have separated from the ceiling by nearly an inch.
- Multiple doors either will no longer close or stay shut.
- The wall paneling throughout the house is splitting and separating at its seams.
- Two windows have broken.
- The hanging kitchen cabinets have gaps.
- Nails in almost every room have come through the ceiling.
- All the ceiling tape in the garage has come down and the drywall on one wall has a huge buckle.
- The ceiling access ladder is offset nearly an inch.
- You can feel air pockets and ridges underfoot in the flooring where the foundation is separating in the kitchen.
- The roof line on the front of the house has pulled away from the front windows to expose a more than 1-1/2" gap from the roof line that needed to be sealed.
- The tile in the front bathroom has started to pop-off & there is a ¼ in gap of the back wall from the ceiling.
- There have been continual plumbing issues with the bathrooms.
- The box behind a light switch in the back bathroom shifted so much that the side screws of the switch arced to the metal box and blew the circuit.

The trustees have been working hard to try and resolve these issues. They have been exploring all the options including trying to fix the foundation once again, renting a house in town or building a new parsonage. The cost to attempt to shore up the foundation again would be upwards of \$25,000 and there is no guarantee with the conditions of the soil that the church would have to do additional repairs in the future. This cost does not include the repairs necessary to fix the existing interior damage due to the shifting. An inspector went over to look at the house and his recommendation was to sell the parsonage as is, without any warranties and build a new parsonage. In looking at rental properties in Edgewood, there are none that fit the minimum criteria or are affordable since the availability is slim.

The board of trustees has voted unanimously to bring a proposal to the congregation to build a new parsonage, sell the existing parsonage and take out a mortgage if necessary, to fund the new parsonage. A half-acre parcel on the north side of town has been offered to be donated in order to build the parsonage on, a floor plan chosen that meets the requirements of the book of discipline and a funding source that we are getting a preliminary funding approval letter from. Rev. David McGlocklin has also contacted the district superintendent Rev. Marlin Fenn and received an approval to bring this forward to the congregation on August 30th at a special called all church conference.

The board will be hosting several in person & on-line presentations and listening posts prior to the August 30th all church conference to go over the details of their preliminary proposal. Our hope is to fully inform the congregation, receive feedback and have a final proposal to the congregation by the August 30th special called all church conference.

We are proposing the following schedule:

Sun. August 9th 11-12 am – Presentation after worship both in-house and on Facebook Feed.

Tue. August 11th 6-7 pm – Presentation on Facebook & zoom

Mon. August 17th 10-11 am – Presentation & Feedback in-house only

Sun. August 23rd 11-12 am – Feedback session after worship both in-house and on Facebook Feed.

Tue. August 25th 9-7 pm – Feedback session on Facebook & Zoom

Sun. August 30th 11-12 pm – Special called all church conference with Final Presentation & Vote

In conversations with DS Marlin Fenn, the book of discipline does not allow for proxy voting for a special called all church conference so we are working out the details of how we can all vote in this season of Covid-19. Our proposal is that we will hold the meeting on August 30th in the sanctuary, broadcast it on Facebook live to members, use a zoom call for those who are able to zoom but don't want to be in the sanctuary, open up additional rooms at the church for individuals who don't have internet and don't want to be in the main sanctuary so that they can participate and setup a call in number for those who only have phone service. We are looking at voting in-house via ballot, on Facebook, on zoom, through texting or on the call-in number via voice vote.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the office to speak with Rev. McGlocklin or contact any of the board members.

We covet your prayers during this process, thank you for your continued generosity and look forward to working with you on dealing with this issue.
